ACTIVITY REPORT 2018-19

Walk With a Scholar (WWS) programme is a new initiative by Higher Education Department, Government of Kerala envisaged to raise the standard of Higher Education Sector to a world class level. It is proposed to arrange specialized mentoring programmes and motivational visits for students in the undergraduate courses, to nurture promising and willing students (mentees) and to provide guidance for their future. This scheme introduces the idea of mentoring and builds on the concept of mentor as a guide and friend. The mentoring is a process where a mentor having greater experience and wisdom guides the mentees to develop both personally and professionally. The WWS scheme aims at giving necessary orientation to needy students, to prepare themselves for employment and give them necessary guidance, motivation and mental support to identify appropriate areas of higher study as well as employment.

WALK WITH A SCHOLAR ACTIVITIES IN NUTSHELL

The activities of WWS for the year 2018-19 were organized at 6 levels in the college.

- 1. Orientation and student selection
- 2. Internal Mentoring
- 3. External Mentoring

- 4. Motivational visit to academic institutes of national and international reputation
- 5. Residential motivation camp.
- 6. Procurement and distribution of study materials and stationary kit
- 7. Mock tests and Mock interview.

ORIENTATION AND SELECTION OF MENTEES

WWS started functioning with an orientation programme for all first year UG students of the college. The programme gave them a clear view about WWS, its functioning and its goals. In July 2018 applications were invited from first year students who had scored a minimum of 60% marks in their higher secondary examinations and those with a genuine interest in the programme. After proper screening of the applications a rank list was prepared based on their scores in the Higher Secondary Examinations. First thirty students in the rank list were selected for the programme and the next two were placed in the reserve list. Mentees of second and third year UG batches hadselected in the previous years and they continue to be beneficiaries of the programme till the end of their UG course..

INTERNAL MENTORING

Internal mentoring aims at providing opportunities with strong foundations of certain

skills, attitudes and competencies. Students were grouped and allotted to internal mentors on the basis of the subject they chose for under graduation and of their specific interests as well. The primary objective of internal mentoring is envisaged to

provide the aspirant some customised activities that enhance their learning experience

and employability skills. The pedagogy of the programme concentrates on active study techniques that require the students to think and reason for themselves.15 members of the teaching faculty were selected as mentors for the 90 students based on their willingness to perform the task. Each internal mentor had to mentor 6mentees allotted to them. A list of internal mentors and the students allotted to

them are given below. An induction programme was also conducted for first year mentors in the college itself before starting the internal mentoring classes.

MOTIVATIONAL TOUR

MOTIVATIONAL CAMP-WALK WITH A SCHOLAR- 2018-19

The Objectives of the motivational camp was to train the students in the following areas.

1. Personality development- The objective of this session is to build self-confidence, enhance self-esteem and improve overall personality of the participants. It aims at grooming the participants through sensitizing them about proper behavior, socially and professionally, in formal and informal circumstances.

- **2. 

Procurement and distribution of study materials and stationary kit

All mentees were supplied with a stationery kit containing a note book, pen and file. Proper documentation has been made in this regard. Besides as study material 'Kerala Administrative Service' (KAS) ,published by Brilliance publishers ,(pages 1300, price 500/- each) Thiruvananthapuram was distributed to the mentees. Recipients' signature has been obtained in the register. This purchase was made by inviting 3 quotations from publishers and book stalls and the least quotation was selected to make purchase. The prior approval of Monitoring committee had also obtained for the same.

Mock test and Mock interview

Two mock tests at the level of national exams were conducted for our final year mentees. What matters most was these exams were conducted strictly in accordance with current exam patterns. Four set of question papers with different alpha codes were prepared and supplied to the students. Bubble type OMR sheets were also given to them for marking their answers. Mentees had been given prior instruction to bring any one of their ID cards with them and enter into the exam hall before half an hour of commencing the exam. After evaluation of their answer sheets rank list was prepared for each exams in the order of marks secured by them. Question papers, OMR sheets and rank list are appended herewith.
