**New Initiatives in Higher Education**

**College at a Glance**

Govt. Arts and Science College Balussery was established in November 2013 in Balussery Legislative Assembly Council. The College was operated in a temporary campus attached to a Govt. LP school at East Kinaloor located nearly 35 kms away from Kozhikode District till 20<sup>th</sup> January 2019. In 20<sup>th</sup> January 2019 the college was informally shifted to own building and formally inaugurated by the honorable Chief minister of Kerala on 20<sup>th</sup> February 2019. At present the college offers three under graduate courses .The College is affiliated to the University of Calicut and has been included under Sections 2(f) of UGC act .

**Scholar Support Programme**

The Scholar Support Programme, part of the “new initiative in Higher Education” initiated by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. Of Kerala aims at extending personalized additional support to students in the subjects included in the curriculum through Tutorials, Study materials, Additional lectures, Question banks and interactive sessions, in addition to special coaching for competitive exams by expert faculties. The following is the brief report of the activities of the SSP held in the College during **2019-20**. As per the instruction obtained from state level training programme on 01.08.2019 Order no.P4/65679/Coll.Edn dtd.22.06.2019. the Programme has been started in September 2019.Colleg Principal incharge Dr.C.J George formaly inaugurated the programme.

**Coordinator:**

ABBAS P.M Asst.Professor of Arabic has been selected as the coordinator of SSP by the College Council.

**Selection of scholars**

Scholars were selected from each Department based on the marks obtained in the qualifying exam and by the tutors` evaluation. Total 130 students of this College were a part of this programme for the year 2019-20. Out of this, 40 students each from second year and first year and 50 students from final year were selected, and they were given intensive coaching in their weak areas by internal trainers.

**ACTIVITY REPORT**

The Programme has been conducted in the college as per the mandate of the scheme in Five components 1.English Coaching 2. Subject Coaching 3.Learning Skills 4. Personal Growth 5.Competitive Exams Training

**i. Internal mentoring**

Internal Training sessions consists of five subjects excluding English in each Year. They are distributed as follows.

1. First year 10 sessions per subjects & 10 sessions for English Coaching (Subject Coaching for First Language)
2. Second year 10 sessions per subjects 10 sessions for English Coaching (Subject Coaching for First Language)
3. Third year 20 sessions per subjects

Due to the lack of Internal Trainers outside faculties were appointed to handle the sessions.

The total internal mentoring engaged in first year BA, B.Com and B.Sc was ....., it was ..... hours each for Second year and..... third year. As per the faculty diary, some of the students have taken the Programme seriously and significant progress has been observed in the status of majority of the selected students. The classes have been monitored by the concerned internal mentors by taking their attendance in each session in the supplied format

### **Internal Trainers**

Internal Trainers were selected after seeking their willingness and sanctioning in the college council and monitoring committee. Five subjects were selected for each Batch and a subject expert was provided for each subject as trainer

. Total 17 Internal Trainers were selected(14+3). This year classes were conducted under SSP for the eligible students in their respective subjects mostly on after regular class hours or Saturdays.

### **External mentors**

External trainers for English Language Skills were selected from the ASAP trainers. Sri. Adarsh, ASAP trainer, took 10 sessions on Learning Skills for I year students on 28/09/2019 and 12/10/2019. The sessions were very inspiring and informative and helped to boost up the confidence of the students and also enhanced their learning skill which also imparted sparks to the students to make their life creative. Psychology Apprentees appointed in the College as Jeevani co-ordinator Smt. Babinarani took 10 sessions for II year on 26/10/2019 and 16/11/2019 5 session in Learning Skills and Personal Growth for I year on 10/09/2019 ,21/10/19,23/10/2019 and 24/10/2019 ,took 5 sessions in Learning Skills and Personal Growth on 04/10/2019 ,19/10/2019,23/10/2019 and 25/10/2019 .

Internal Sessions for English engaged English Faculties from Dr.B.R Ambedkar Memmorial Govt.Arts & Science College,Balussery, Mr. Prasanth. P, Smt. Aanaswara, each of them carry 10 sessions.

Competitive Exam coaching are conducted by the faculty Sri.Sarvy Joseph from Dr.B.R Ambedkar Memmorial Govt.Arts & Science College, and he engaged 40 sessions in different topics. (**Schedule attached Annexure-C**)
